

CAST YOUR NET

The stewardship way of life could be described as a daily pursuit of the kingdom of heaven. In our Gospel passage from Matthew today, Jesus employs three parables to describe this kingdom.

In the first of today's parables, our Lord reminds us that living for Him and for His kingdom will be costly. But the deep joy that comes in following Him makes the "price" entailed worth it. Jesus says, "The kingdom of heaven is like a treasure buried in a field which a person finds and hides again, and out of joy goes and sells all that he has and buys that field." Next, He says the kingdom of heaven is "like a merchant searching for fine pearls. When he finds a pearl of great price, he goes and sells all he has and buys it."

In each of these stories, the kingdom of heaven is somewhat "hidden." We must intentionally search for it amidst the noise of the world that bombards us. Yet, our Lord reminds us that His Kingdom is meant for everyone and He wants us to find it! He says, "It is like a net thrown into the sea which collects fish of every kind."

But Jesus concludes His teaching with a rather ominous image, reminding us that every "fish" will also be judged as good or bad. "The angels will go out and separate the wicked from the righteous and throw them into the fiery furnace." This is a description that is difficult to forget. Clearly Jesus wants to get our attention.

Let us pray for the wisdom to recognize the kingdom of heaven in our midst and intensify our efforts to pursue it starting right now. There is no time to lose, and we will obtain the immeasurable joy that only comes when we live as disciples of Jesus.

PARISH FINANCIAL SUPPORT

Before COVID-19, it was already difficult to get people to attend regularly for both weekday and weekend Masses. We are yearly updating our outreach to young families, and to our youth through the celebrations of baptism, first reconciliation and first holy communion and confirmation.

After re-opening only 10% of our parish membership has returned. Ironically, at a time when the world needs the Gospel the most, it appears to be least interested. Everywhere you look, its bad news. But the path to the good news is blazed by others who keep moving through all the bad news. We have entered into hard times. This is perhaps not just a COVID-19 related, but a cultural reality.

We encourage and welcome others to return to the celebration of weekday and weekend Masses.

Many have opted to continue with online Sunday and Weekday Masses which is acceptable. We are asking and encouraging that "WE" continue our financial support to our parish.

"ETIQUETTE AT EUCHARIST"

All parishioners are encouraged to wear a face mask when entering the church (except the very young and those with breathing difficulties).

The ushers will direct you to the pew. We know that some have expressed a desire to sit where they usually do. This is not possible at this time.

Communicants are to remove their masks while the person ahead of them is receiving and bow; and after the priest says "the Body of Christ" and the answer "Amen" is given, only then does the communicant cross the red line (hands extended) to receive and step into the "box" to consume the Bread of Life.

Note well: The washrooms are to be used only if absolutely necessary; parishioners making their way there during Mass tend to be a distraction to the others. As well, please refrain from touching any surfaces upon entering or exiting the church (anything touched has to be cleaned). The doors are closed (locked?) when Mass begins for a reason: the ushers have a right to worship and are not obliged to wait unnecessarily. Also, attending one Mass on the weekend is sufficient; please be mindful of others by not taking a space someone else could have.

Lastly, be respectful of the ushers and cleaners and their tasks; their willingness to serve is of benefit to us all because if there are no ushers and no cleaners there can be no open church.
