Sixth Sunday of Easter the Scriptures

First Reading: Acts of the Apostles 15:1-2,22-29

The early Church community determines, with the help of the Holy Spirit, not to impose the requirement of circumcision on Gentile Christians.

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 67:2-3,5,6,8

A prayer that all the nations sing praise to God. **Second Reading:** Revelation 21:10-14,22-23

The vision of the splendor of the heavenly Jerusalem is described.

Gospel Reading: John 14:23-29

Jesus promises his disciples that the Father will send the Advocate, the Holy Spirit.

Background on the Gospel Reading

This portion of John's Gospel comes near the end of the first of four chapters that make up Jesus' long farewell discourse at the Last Supper. This section of chapter 14 actually sums up the themes of the opening of the discourse: the Christian's life is not shaped by Jesus' absence but by God's abiding presence; God's presence overcomes anxiety about God's absence; and the present holds in it the seeds of a fresh future shaped by love, not fear.

These verses also contain a glimpse of some of the other themes of the farewell discourse: Jesus' relationship with the Father and the disciples' relationship to Jesus connect the disciples to the Father as well. Jesus promises to send an Advocate or intercessor who will remind the disciples of everything that Jesus taught them and bring them peace.

Jesus is preparing his disciples in advance for his absence so that they will continue to believe in him and not feel all alone after his return to the Father. After the initial excitement of his Easter appearances, Jesus will remain with his followers in a very different way.



CATHEDRAL APPEAL FORWARD IN FAITH

Cathedral of St. Catherine of Alexandria

An extensive restoration project for our Cathedral has been underway since last fall and the work is scheduled to be completed by November 2020, when our diocesan Cathedral will be 175 years old. It has been in need of significant repairs and refreshing. The major work being done includes a complete interior paint restoration, new paintings on the ceiling, restoration of mosaic floors in the sanctuary, LED lighting, sound system upgrades, high efficiency heating and cooling, and any other work needed to preserve our Cathedral for generations to come. Why is the Cathedral important to our parish? Because it is our central place of worship, the "mother church" of 44 parishes that make up our diocese. If the Cathedral is the mother church, then we, as members of the diocese, are "her children," Together now, as a diocese, we need to look to the future, and look forward in faith! We have an opportunity to play a part in restoring, revitalizing, renewing, and rejuvenating our Cathedral. We are now launching the Cathedra Appeal across the diocese. This appeal needs the support of many to reach its overall target of \$1.2 million. The 44 parishes in the diocese are asked to contribute a combined total of \$500,000 towards that amount; the remaining \$700,000 will be raised through corporate donations and other gifts. For the first year of the appeal the goal for the parishes is an attainable \$250,000. The first-year goal for each parish has been set at approximately 3% of ordinary income. The total contribution at the end of the Appeal will be 6% of ordinary income.

The set target for St. Martin of Tours Church is \$6,500.00. Together, we can meet this target.
